 the slope above their well, they will plant native shrubs and trees to reduce soil erosion, stabilizing the hillside and encouraging water penetration to recharge the aquifer. At the ranch, compost spread over grazed lands will add soil organic matter, thereby increasing soil carbon storage. Mulching the blueberry fields will increase soil moisture and cut irrigation demand.
