Emerald Seed Company breeds disease-resistant seed varieties, which they sell throughout the world. Located near the Mexican border, the farm has limited access to water and experiences unpredictable precipitation and wind storms. The farm relies on surface water delivery which fluctuates annually depending on statewide water supplies and snowpack. With the SWEEP grant, Grower and Operations Manager Josh Cordova invested in infrastructure to increase their water security. To capture and store more water when it is available, they built an on-site reservoir. Josh also installed an electric pump to replace their

diesel-powered pump, which reduces carbon emissions and energy costs. Soil moisture sensors enable Josh to manage irrigation more efficiently.
