In 2013, Pao Yang started farming on 40 acres of family land recently converted from almonds and grapes to a diversified Asian vegetable and herb operation. Pao received technical assistance from UC Cooperative Extension that enabled him to successfully apply for his SWEEP grant. With the funds, Pao replaced valves and installed drip irrigation throughout the farm, resulting in significant water use and cost savings. His energy use is also reduced (and therefore greenhouse gas emissions)—he estimates his farm's annual \$8,000 energy bill is halved as a result of these improvements. Because he is able to deliver water more precisely to his crops, Pao is seeing less weed pressure which reduces labor costs, increases yields, and bolsters his farm's economic viability.
