For Nathanael Siemens, farming is about honoring the generations of farmers before him. He is a 4th generation farmer, whose grandparents grew cotton and alfalfa and whose parents couldn't afford to continue to farm. When Nate decided to farm 10 years ago, he chose to do dry farmed grain. His operation has since diversified into dry farmed almonds, wheat, cotton and livestock. Nathanael used Healthy Soils funding to plant a leguminous cover

crop beneath the almond canopy where his livestock graze before and after the almond harvest. Nathanael also plants ancient grains beneath the almonds, turning the understory into harvestable pasture. This system has increased production, biodiversity, soil organic matter and water holding capacity.
