Leonard Loewen is a farmer in Glenn County and has been working the land since childhood. He has been managing 110 acres of walnuts since 2013 where he has reduced synthetic fertilizers and pesticides by applying compost and cover crops.

In 2019 Leonard successfully applied for a Healthy Soils Program (HSP) grant to introduce compost to 32 additional acres and mulch to 68 acres. The combination of practices has increased water holding capacity and produced a dark, nutrient-rich layer at the top of the soil indicating good soil structure and conditions that hold on to the carbon instead of releasing it into the atmosphere.

As Leonard has adopted new practices, his mindset has also changed. He hopes other farmers will experience a similar transition through support by HSP.
